**Program:** Catherine Thompson introduced Elaine Allen, a Master Gardener and beekeeper who lives in the Cooley Springs area. Elaine and her husband Garland got into bee-keeping after the quality of their garden crops lessened. They learned disease had killed about 90% of feral honeybees; this loss meant less pollination and thus less produce and flowers. Garland began a Master Beekeeper credential course of study, and they started their bee-keeping business. Elaine explained the life cycle and hive organization of honeybees. She explained that bees are responsible for about 33% of the food we eat and that how and what we use for pesticides affect the survival of the bees. Steps we can take to help the honeybees include placing plants around the house and yard to allow the bees access without disturbing humans, using organic sprays and insect control agents, and educating others about the value of honeybees. Linda presented our speaker with a cookbook as a gift. Marggi announced that next month's speaker will be Lisa Muehlenbein, who will speak about massage therapy and yoga.
